## Location

Info about the town and University: Granada is a historic town of around 250,000 inhabitants, world-famous as the site of the Alhambra palace and situated 20 miles to the north of the spectacular Sierra de Nevada, and around 50 miles north of the Mediterranean coast.

### **Orientation week**

3. You must complete and send us the Erasmus application form
4. Following the nomination you must in most cases, complete a registration online. The International Placements Team will contact you about this.
5. Read the Study Plan (available on Blackboard from June)
6. Complete a Learning Agreement once your modules have been approved by your Placement Tutor
